Visitors and Competition Winners travelled from across the United Kingdom and Ireland to see the winning flock and prize presentation by Alex Gray, Langside Flock, Lanarkshire, who judged the 2014 competition.

## The results were as follows:

**W Borthwick (Ballochmyle)** - Ayrshire won The John Long Cup - Best Small Flock Winner 0-30 Ewes and The Sainsbury Cup - Best Ewe lambs.

**Patrick Donnelly (Donrho)** – Co Antrim won The Bristol Gold Cup for Best Overall Flock, The W E Lloyd Cup for Best Flock 31 -60 Ewes, The Bonnington Salver for Best Flock of Ewes, The Chebsey Cup for Best Progeny Group (with Baileys Paddy's Power) & Reserve in Best Ewe Lambs.

**S J Buckley (Sitlow)** – Derbyshire won The Keeble Cup for Best Flock 61 – 100 ewes & The Howard Peel Cup for Best Stud Rams as well as Reserve in Best overall Flock.

**JW Hallam & SM Eggleston (Seagrave)** – Leicestershire – won The Brooks Cup for Best Flock 100 + Ewes.

## Other flocks which the Judge highlighted were:

The **Horton Flock of Jack Pryce** and his late wife from Powys, received Reserve in the 0-30 Ewes category and Reserve for their Stud Rams.

**Tom Fitzsimon – Sunnyhills Flock** – Dumfries, was Reserve with his ram Rhaeadr Topman in the Progeny Group.

**County Turf Ltd** – **Hazeltree Flock** – North Lincolnshire, received Reserve in both the 31 – 60 Ewes and the Best Flock of Ewes categories.

**William Montgomery – Smiddiehill Flock** – Co Down was Reserve in the 61 -100 Ewes class

**Irene Fowlie – Essie Flock -** Aberdeenshire was Reserve in the 100+ Ewe category.

Also presented on the day was the Sire of the Year Trophy to PDW Taylor for Ballynacanon Commander. This trophy is awarded to the

breeder of a ram that has sired the top average price of three ram lambs. Ballynacanon Commander's sons sold to 20,000gns, 5,500gns and 5,000gns to average £10,675.
